How many students spelled 16 or 18 words correctly?

A student is most likely to spell words correctly.

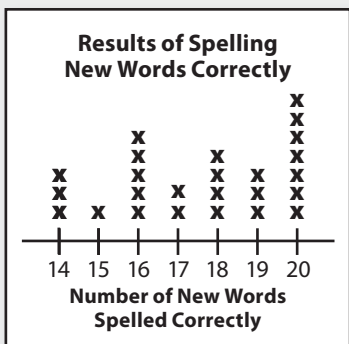
14 16 18 20

How many students spelled 16 words correctly?



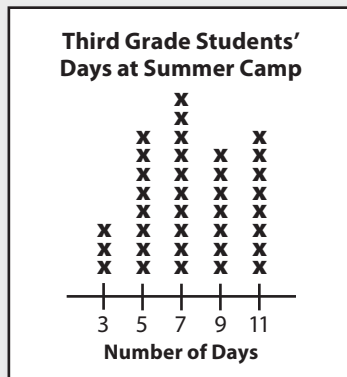
This line plot shows how many days third grade students spent at summer camp.

How many students went to summer camp?

A student is most likely to spend days in summer camp.

How many students spent 5 or 7 days at camp?

How many more students spent 5 days at camp than those staying 9 days?
